### **ABOUT US**

Ektara is a registered Trust which started its operations in the Topsia and Tiljala slums of Kolkata in 2011. The main programmes run by Ektara include:

- Education
- Nutrition
- Health
- Hygiene
- Community Engagement

Ektara's direct beneficiary base in 2017 is 700 women and children, who are part of the programmes mentioned above.

The major focus points of Ektara's programme and projects are:

Holistic development of a child- The curriculum covered at Ektara is not restricted to just academics. There are a wide range of Extra Curricular Activities for children to support their overall growth. The programmes on Nutrition, Health and WESH, contribute to the same.

Creation of employment opportunities for as many women and girls from the community as possible. Keeping this in mind, employment is provided to mothers of the children who study with Ektara- in various capacities such as cleaners, cooks and attendants. The younger and partially educated girls from the community are given training and encouraged to finish their school and college, alongside which they are given employment as helper teachers who assist our trained and certified teachers.

Empowering women and children in the community by giving them access to quality learning, information and knowledge.






















### **EDUCATION**

The main projects of Ektara in 2016 under the Education Programme are:



Over the years, Ektara's beneficiary base for the education programme has gone up manifolds. In 2016 there was an increase in our Montessori project as well as our Primary section project with the inception of Class 2.



#### Montessori

This project had over 180 children and was divided into 3 age groups of 3+ years, 4+ years and 5+ years. Classes were conducted by fully trained Montessori teachers with support from helper teachers and caregivers. The teacher student ratio was 1:20 and a lot of emphasis was laid on the usage of Montessori tools and apparatus for classes at all levels.

At the end year for the students enrolled in the senior most group of 5+ years, there was an assessment to identify the most deserving children who were then mainstreamed into some of the city's leading schools while the rest move into our Primary Section.



### **EDUCATION**

#### **Primary section**

A curriculum, designed in line with the syllabi of mainstream schools was used for this project. Trained teachers conducted different subject classes to ensure that there was no compromise in the quality of teaching imparted at this level. The children were divided into four sections of 25 children each, in keeping with their abilities. In 2016 we added Class 2, taking the total of the primary section to 180 children.



#### School support program

The formal school education of students from this group was fully supported by Ektara. Regular remedial classes post school hours were held on a daily basis. For the brightest minds at Ektara, some of the city's leading schools such as Jewish Girls School, The Park English School were chosen.


#### Non-Formal

Science, Social Studies, was designed to re-integrate school drop outs into the formal school system. Smart boards were introduced to this group as it aids in quicker comprehension and grasping by the students.

251 beneficiaries have been under direct intervention of health program of which 208 children were supported in the physical health project by empanelled doctors. All these children were financially supported for their pathological as well as doctor's visit and follow-up.

Our Mental health consultant has been working with 43 children identified and referred by the teachers.





### **HEALTH**

The health program has a full time nurse to address First Aid for children considering our beneficiary strength is 535.







### NUTRITION

#### Timeline -1year

No. of beneficiaries covered under this program –715 (Beneficiaries include all the Children from Montessori section, primary section, Non formal, school children, Trainees in the vocation training)

Under the Greenply funded Nutrition Program, The snack is provided to all the beneficiaries of Ektara and Mid Day meal is provided to all the children studying in the Primary section. The Montessori (Age group 3-5 years) starts at 9.45 and continues till 1 pm. This group of children gets a wholesome breakfast, as they have early dispersal. The children in the Primary section get food twice a day. They are provided with light snack during the recess and at the end of the day all of them have mid day meal and go home.

A batch of students from the primary section every day stays back at Ektara for the remedial classes and this group gets a second helping of snack at the end of the day.

A snack is also provided to all the Trainees and community girls in the Vocational Training Program of Ektara

The Menu plan changes according to the changes in availability of seasonal fruits and vegetables procured from the local market. Ektara follows three types of menu plan to give a variety to taste and preference

### WESH

The WESH project at Ektara commenced essentially to develop a complete package of education and awareness on Water, Environment Hygiene and Sanitation for the children, parents and staff members of the organisation. Carefully designed learning modules, audio visuals, assessment sheets, hygiene kit distribution drive, green classrooms are some of the major initiatives taken to make the project child friendly We have put in an effort to maximise community involvement to run this project effectively.

### **UTKARSH**


One of our main highlights for the year 2016, is Utkarsh, a project under the Education Programme. This project uses digital medium to provide high quality educational content along with a learning management system for children and school dropouts. The smart class brought an exhaustive repository of world class digital modules or lessons, (consisting of 2D and 3D animations, graphics, audio and video) on every subject in the K12 spectrum, which the teacher could easily access and project in the classroom that illuminated and explained abstract and



difficult concepts with liquid clarity.

In addition to the laptops we are proud to say that we were able to purchase content and tablets from CG Slate, a leading smart class solution provider. The content is suitable for children from Class 1 to Class 3. n addition to the laptops we are proud to say that we were able to purchase content and tablets from CG Slate, a leading smart class solution provider. The content is suitable for children from Class 1 to Class 3.programme who are Currently we have 180 beneficiaries from the Primary Section and 180 from the school support benefiting from this programme.

Additionally Ektara has 22 laptops which the children use to learn fundamentals of computer, basic Microsoft Office and also improve their typing skills.



Under the digital literacy project Utkarsh, currently we have a smart board which is installed in one of the classrooms at Ektara. The smart board content consists of thousands of highly animated, lesson specific, 3D and 2D multimedia modules built with an Instructor-led design that allows the teacher to effectively explain the lesson in a typical classroom of diverse set of learners. This board is also used for the school support programme section of Ektara, for viewing movies and other educational content, related to their syllabus.






Gulafsha Khatoon, A true example of success is not final, failure is not fatal, it is the courage to continue to that counts.






